100 YEARS AGO

Local: Newton Abbot RDC agreed to ask Devon County Council for a 10mph speed limit for Chudleigh, where drivers were causing a dust nuisance since the ending of the use of the street watering cart.

National: The Easter Rising in Ireland ended. The British government introduced daylight saving measures -three weeks after Germany had implemented them.
