THIS MONTH.....

100 YEARS AGO

Local: Gove was admitted to Trusham School (aged 3) -number on roll now 28. One day's Whitsun holiday. Ralph Howard was excluded because he was suffering from impetigo.

National: On June 5th, Lord Kitchener, Secretary of State for War, known for his image on 'Your country needs YOU' recruiting posters, died with 600 others, when their boat hit a mine off Orkney. The 12th June Whit Bank Holiday was abandoned.

International: The only major World War I naval clash, involving 100,000 men/250 ships, the Battle of Jutland (or Skagerrak) lasted just 72 hours, ending on June 1st. Britain lost more men (6784) and ships (14), than Germany but maintained control of the North Sea. Among the victims was 16 year old Jack Cornwell, who was posthumously awarded of the VC. In his memory, The Scouts Cornwell Award is given to Scouts under 20, who have shown courage and endurance under extreme conditions.
