THIS MONTH.....

100 YEARS AGO

Local: *R.I.P.* Sidney Dyer, of Trusham, killed in action on July 1st, together with 160 others of the 8th+9th Devonshires. Survivors left a wooden sign, in respect of comrades lying at Mametz, the Somme. Its words were put on a stone memorial in 1980 -

*'The Devonshires held this trench,
the Devonshires hold it still.'*

National: Philosopher, Bertrand Russell spoke against the War at a public meeting, saying there was no good or valid reason why the war should continue. He was banned from living in or entering areas so prohibited by the Aliens Restrictions Act - about a third of the country.

International: The Battle of the Somme began on July 1st when British & French troops advanced across no-man's land, in the face of enemy machine guns and artillery. It ended on November 18th, the Allies gaining about 12 km, both sides losing an estimated 1 million dead/injured - *a true war of attrition.*
