100 YEARS AGO

Local: Trusham School children were dismissed for their summer holiday on August 2nd to return on September 2nd.

National: The documentary film *The Battle of the Somme* gave horrified audiences their first realistic impression of the war. About 20 million saw it in its first six weeks. On 21st August an explosion at the Low Moor munitions works, Bradford killed 38 and injured over 100 people

International: Romania declared war on Austria-Hungary while Italy declared war on Germany, so increasing Allied forces.

Several generations later, Samuel Augustus Maverick, a Texas lawyer, politician, land owner, gave his name to the term maverick meaning independently minded, allegedly because he refused to brand his cattle.
