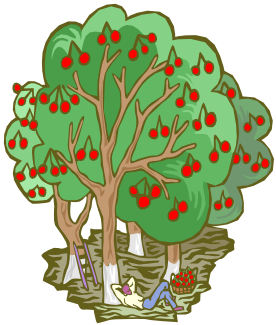

100 YEARS AGO

Local: Mrs Cleave of Tucketts Farm, when applying for John Denford, employed as a horseman on her farm, to be exempted from military service, was told that casual labour 'could be got'. She responded 'But not at Trusham'.

National: 24 September - Following a bombing raid on east London, a Zeppelin made a forced landing in Essex; its crew were the only armed enemy personnel to set foot in England during the War

International: The Somme offensive continued, with tanks being used for the first time. By the end of the month, heavy rain had turned the entire battlefield into mud. And so, the attrition continued.

TOUR OF BRITAIN

Relive the excitement of the Rio cycling events - The Tour of Britain Cycle Race returns to our bit of Devon on **Friday 9th September**. The race will feature a world-class line-up - ten of the UCI's WorldTour teams, with top tier sportsmen making up half the field. Among the participants will be Team Dimension Data including Mark Cavendish and Team Wiggins - Sir Bradley Wiggins has stated he intends to ride the Tour of Britain following his Rio success. It's the Sixth Stage, covering 93 miles with 3,100 metres of climbs.



Start: Sidmouth Esplanade 11:30 then through Mid Devon/East Dartmoor; eta Ide 14:29; Dunchideock 14:35; Chudleigh 14.50; Bovey Tracey 14:57; Finish; Haytor 15:09.

A detailed route map (and estimated arrival times can be found at www.tourofbritain.co.uk This is useful for identifying steep climbs where they might slow down a fraction to enable identification)

After their breathless King of the Mountains race through Dunchideock up to Haldon, there is their speedy Chudleigh Sprint. There will be music and entertainment from midday on the Town Hall forecourt and around town, The Primary School children will give a drumming and other musical instruments display along the church wall opposite The Bishop Lacy.

WARNING: The race route will be subject to a running road closure to traffic for about 20 minutes as the race goes through. Parking on the route will be prohibited 9am-4pm and restrictions applied to all parking/ loading bays.

This is a short term solution whilst we wait for the phone box (now 'pillar box red' - thanks to Mike and his paintbrush) to be adequately equipped to house the defibrillator. Both Dad and I are trained so if we're in then one of us will happily help but the instructions are very

clear if we're unavailable. If there is an emergency, please call 999 first and if possible send someone else to get the defib. The casualty's safety is paramount and paramedics will need someone to refer to upon arrival. .
