100 YEARS AGO


Local: Wilfred Ashplant; 8th Battalion, Devonshire Regiment. Son of Thomas + Minnie Ashplant. Born in Trusham in 1899 Died 2nd October 1917 aged 18. Named with 34,991 others on the Tyne Cot Memorial National: Shortages of staples such as wheat, sugar, tea, bacon and butter caused concern,though there was a surplus of potatoes.

International: Russia underwent another change of regime when the Bolsheviks, seized power in the October Revolution (November in western calendar dates). Lenin led the world's first Communist state.

The older pupils will help her to create the mosaics which will be assembled in her studio and installed in Chudleigh soon after. It is anticipated that around 60 children will play a part in this.
