100 YEARS AGO

Local: During November, twelve vessels (cargo/fishing) were sunk by enemy action off the Devon coast.

National: Continuing and growing shortages led to the government introducing controls for the price of bread, 'the nine penny loaf' and encouraged voluntary rationing.

International: Foreign Secretary, Arthur Balfour, declared Britain's intention to provide a homeland for Jewish people in Palestine. Britain had already promised support for Arab independence and agreed with France as to how France and Britain would share control of a defeated Ottoman Empire.

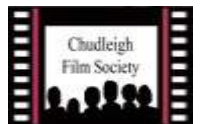
CHUDLEIGH FILM SOCIETY

On **17th November** Lady Clifford will be highlighting the changes that turned a granary store into one of England's finest country houses. The new mosaics project is going well. Following the meeting between the artist, Monica Shanta Brown and the children, the workshops with the older children took place towards the end of September. The mosaics will be at the Library, Constitutional Club and in the Woodway Room.

We are keeping a close watch on the discovery of a Bronze Age ceremonial site at Station Hill where building preparations for the new estate revealed a large site spanning two fields. Investigations by the County Archaeologist are at an early stage but it would appear to be an important find.
