THIS MONTH.....

100 YEARS AGO

Local: Randle Cecil, eldest son of Bishop Cecil of Exeter and Lady Cecil, aged 28, was killed at Cambrai, on 1st December. Their youngest son Rupert died, aged 20, at Ypres in July 1915. A third son, Jack, was killed, aged 25, in August 1918. Only one son, Victor, survived the war.

National: 23 MPs voted against a bill to give the vote to women over 30. The government imposed sugar rationing (8 oz per person per week).

International: Ceasefire between Germany and Russia meant Germany could deploy more troops on the Western Front. General Allenby led British troops into Jerusalem, following the Ottoman Empire's surrender of the city.
