100 YEARS AGO

Local: A Lantern Lecture held in Trusham, thanks to the Rev Offley Carey, raised £1 8d for the British Red Cross. A Chudleigh flag day raised £11 for the egg collection scheme, which by this time had received donations of over 27 million eggs for wounded soldiers.

National: This month the German Navy sank 230 ships bringing food and other supplies to Britain. This made growing food shortages worse. Voluntary rationing was introduced.

International: President Woodrow Wilson ended diplomatic relations with Germany, whose resumed policy of unrestricted U boat warfare put US merchant ships in danger.
