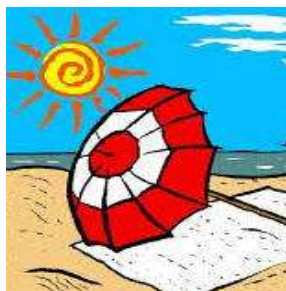

THIS MONTH.....

100 YEARS AGO

Local: Tuckett's and Cridford Farm, Symons Farm, Whetcombe Barton Farm, Trusham Quarry; Trusham New Inn plus small holding, Burgoins tenement, 5 life-hold cottages with gardens - Hill Cottages and Mount Pleasant, 4 leasehold cottages - Vinnicombes; cottage, smithy and garden - part of Chicks' 5 cottages and gardens - Rattle Street were all advertised as lots in the huge Haldon Estate auction.

National: July 1st a huge shell factory explosion in Chilwell, Nottinghamshire: 134 killed, 32 bodies identified.

July 15th rationing of butter, margarine, lard, meat, sugar began.

International: July 16th Tsar Nicholas II and his family were murdered at Ekaterinburg.

July 18th Allied forces launched a counterattack ending the Second Battle of the Marne - turning the tide of the war towards an Allied victory

POPPIES AND COMMEMORATION

You may have noticed troughs of poppies are now in flower along the wall in front of the war memorial. As part of the Memorial Mob initiative to encourage organisations, villages, individuals create a carpet of crimson from Lands End to John O'Groats to remember all those killed or wounded in WW1. The 'Ribbon of Poppies' idea has caught the imagination across continents - from the Orkneys to the Falklands, from California to Indonesia, Australia and New Zealand.

Joining with The British Legion Appeal 2018 in Chudleigh, Trusham Village and Church have jointly sponsored a certificate which commemorates the death of Sidney James Sampson, born in Trusham in 1897, living at Burgoynes in 1901 then Clifford Street in

Chudleigh in 1911. He was killed in Mesopotamia, aged 18. The certificate may be seen in the Village Hall. Details of those whose names are on our Village War Memorial are in a special folder in the church, by the War Memorial at the entrance to the tower.
