100 YEARS AGO

Local: Many witnessed the funeral, at the Higher Cemetery, of Pte Hugo Schrader, a German PoW, who died at Exeter's No.1 War Hospital. The coffin was conveyed by gun carriage, escorted by soldiers.

National: Large explosion in Dover harbour as HMS Glatton blew up. At least 57 - possibly as many as 80 died on board

International: British forces advanced in Palestine, taking Nazareth, Haifa and Acre. The Allied advance in Flanders continued.

EXETER'S WAR HOSPITALS 1914-1919

Exeter's WWI Red Cross Hospitals were amongst the earliest commissioned. Ready by late August, their first patients came in early October. By Christmas 1914 they provided more Red Cross beds than any other UK provincial town. Over 35,000 patients, many sent from France or Flanders by hospital ship and then ambulance train from Southampton, were treated in Exeter's eight hospitals between 1914 and 1919



This year's War Hospitals' exhibition in Exeter Guildhall **September 14-16, 10am- 4pm** includes food and Red Cross cooks. How did the ladies manage to feed thousands of patients and staff at a time of food shortages?
How many of you knew that there was a WWI hospital in Chudleigh? Alpha House, in Fore Street, was used as a VAD hospital.
One patient who died was buried in an unmarked grave (a Portuguese forestry labourer). Members of

Chudleigh History Group have rectified this with a cross 'In memory of Antonio Da Silva. A member of the Portuguese Labour Corps at the lumber camp at Stover. Died of pneumonia at Chudleigh VAD Hospital 11 Oct. 1917.
