THIS MONTH.....

100 YEARS AGO

Local: Four Newton Abbot boys were charged with breaking, entering and theft. One used a stolen cheque for £13 8s 3d to buy rifles, airguns, clothes and train trips. The youngest received 6 strokes of the birch, the others were remanded. They were advised to avoid picture palaces, where 'nasty pamphlets' incited them to commit such crimes.

National: The army was called in, with tanks, to deal with protests against high rents in Glasgow. Soldiers blockaded Folkestone harbour - a successful protest against being returned to France.

International: The left-wing Spartacist Revolt in Berlin was crushed by the Freikorps, right-wing ex-soldiers. The 18th Amendment to the US Constitution banned the production, transport and sale of alcohol - Prohibition began.

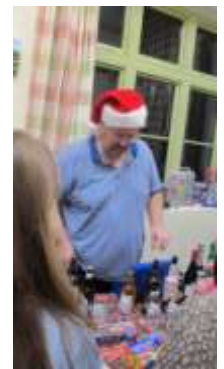
