100 YEARS AGO

Local: Trusham School closed on April 17th for the Easter holiday (1 week). On instruction from Mr Cleave, to be sold at auction on April 28th, 65 acres of meadow and pasture grass in lots, to be grazed to Lady-day next.

National: April 3rd the Government agreed to begin the release of imprisoned conscientious objectors.

International: April 13th, British and Gurkha troops, on orders from General Dyer, fired on an unarmed gathering, killing 379 Sikhs and injuring over 1200 others at Jallianwala Bagh in Amritsar, Punjab Province in British India.
