THIS MONTH.....

100 YEARS AGO

Local: 19th July, Exeter Peace Day celebrations included a Cathedral service which all schools attended, a Victory March through the city, fireworks and a large bonfire, built by Exeter Cycling Club, on the golf links at Pennsylvania, with music from The Salvation Army Band

National: 18th July: the Cenotaph, designed by Lutyens, was unveiled. 19th July: Peace Day victory parades across Britain. 19th-23rd July, 'Peace Riots' in towns including Coventry, Swindon and Luton, where the Town Hall was burned down

International: Violence committed by white youths against blacks on July 27th led to a week of riots in Chicago. 38 people died and over 500 were injured.
