THIS MONTH.....

100 YEARS AGO

Local: A blaze on Haldon destroyed over 1000 acres and threatened even more as it spread in the direction of Chudleigh. The roads were thick with millions of escaping insects and reptiles.

National: The Restoration of Pre-War Practices Act meant servicemen should be able to return to their old job. August 30th the Football League restarted, four years after it was abandoned due to the war.

International: August 8th the Treaty of Rawalpindi, meant an armistice during the Third Anglo-Afghan War. Britain recognised Afghanistan's independence, and agreed that British India would not extend past the Khyber Pass.

TRUSHAM VILLAGE MEETING

Precis of minutes of the meeting - Tuesday 9th July

- **Teign Valley Community Hall refurbishment:** It was agreed to support Corony Edwards (TVCC) in applying for lottery funding, and to provide a contact person and representative for consultation. Also to explore ways to promote the use of the hall to villagers.*
- **Workload:** It was agreed that sub groups (not necessarily of committee members) should be used for larger projects.
- **Planning:** Planning notices will be made an agenda item for meetings (agenda on the noticeboard and trusham.com and in i~trusham. It was agreed that the committee should become involved only if appropriate.
- **Neighbourhood Plan:** Ali agreed to investigate the feasibility of adopting a Neighbourhood Plan.
- **Climate emergency:** Audrey Compton will be invited to our next meeting to share ideas and approaches.
- **Parish Matters:**

Potholes in Teign lane have been reported.

Footpaths: There is no P3 footpath warden- Ali to investigate. Thanks to Phil Brooks who continues to maintain footpaths. Colin noted that Japanese knotweed on the footpath by Trusham Heights must be sprayed in the spring. It was proposed that the footpath map could be put onto the village website, to promote their use.

Events: Christmas fair-: Saturday 7th December 4 - 7pm. Mary Cook to lead an organising committee. Sarah Maybin to arrange a winter viewing of the Revels. Summer Barn dance 2020 to be discussed at next meeting.

Marquees: Colin Edwards to arrange date for erecting/ checking the marquees donated by Jim and Penny Putz. Mary Cook to investigate cost of a Keter shed for their storage.

Park benches: these have been replaced where necessary. Mike Chadwick investigating wheelchair accessible picnic table.

War memorial: Grass to be left untrimmed until autumn.

AOB:

- Steven Purser to be asked for advice re power storage from the Village Hall solar panels.
- Safety issues were raised concerning GM Coachworks parking vehicles along the Valley road.
- As HGVs can get into difficulties in the lane and square, Devon Highways will be asked about providing signage.
- Colin Edwards will contact Teignbridge re supply of sandbags for emergencies.
- Notice needed for village green/play park gate re. dogs.

Village Hall

A sub group has been set up to decide on how the kitchen may be used, what facilities will be needed and implementation of health and safety requirements.

Management of the hall, housekeeping arrangements, rates charged, terms/conditions for hire. Necessary repair of storage shed roof to be assessed.

IN TRUSHAM IN 'AN AUGUST AGO'

Radford Maverick. Trusham's rector since 1586 resigned in August 1616. His successor, Adrian Norman, proved to be one of Trusham's most loyal servants. Ordained in 1614, he came to the village on 17th August 1616 with his heavily pregnant wife (Joan Merdon) and baby daughter Sarah. A second daughter, Marie, was baptised in Trusham the month after the Normans arrived. Buried 5th December 1653. Three sons and three more daughters were born in Trusham, two dying in infancy. His wife was buried in Trusham in 1644, two years after the start of the turmoil brought by the English Civil War. In 1653, Adrian Norman was replaced by a Rev Haycroft, who was more acceptable to the church's patron, Thomas Southcote of Shillingford. Within months, Haycroft was ousted. Adrian Norman returned to Trusham, his long time home, where he died in 1653. His name is inscribed on one of the church bells. His eldest surviving son, John (born in Trusham in 1622), became Vicar of Bridgewater, but was ejected as, true to his Presbyterian beliefs, he refused to conform to the Act of Uniformity. He was imprisoned in Ilchester and from 1647-1660 was confined to his home by the militia, as a 'religious fanatic'.

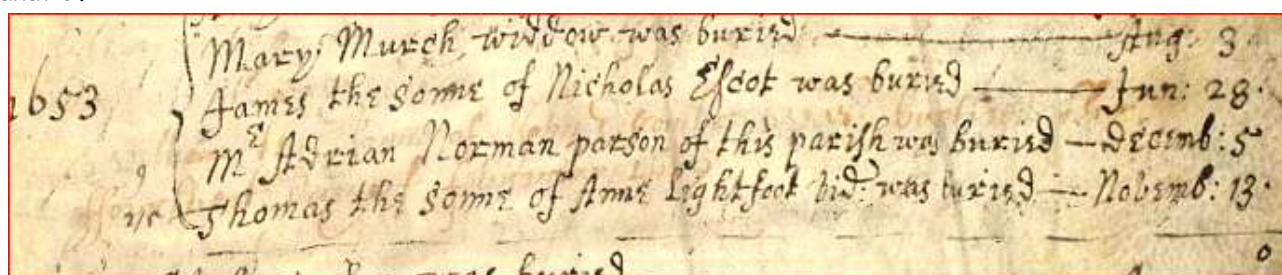
