### 100 YEARS AGO

**Local:** Major W.G.W. Durham, only remaining son of Trusham's Rector, Rev W.E. Durham, was killed on September 19<sup>th</sup> in the unrest on the Indian frontier that followed the Third Anglo-Afghan War.

**National:** British government declared Sinn Fein's Dáil Eireann (parliament) illegal - a vicious guerrilla war between the Irish Republican Army and British forces followed.

**International:** September 12<sup>th</sup> an unknown Adolf Hitler became the seventh member of the little Known German Worker's Party, with an agenda of nationalism and anti-Semitism.
